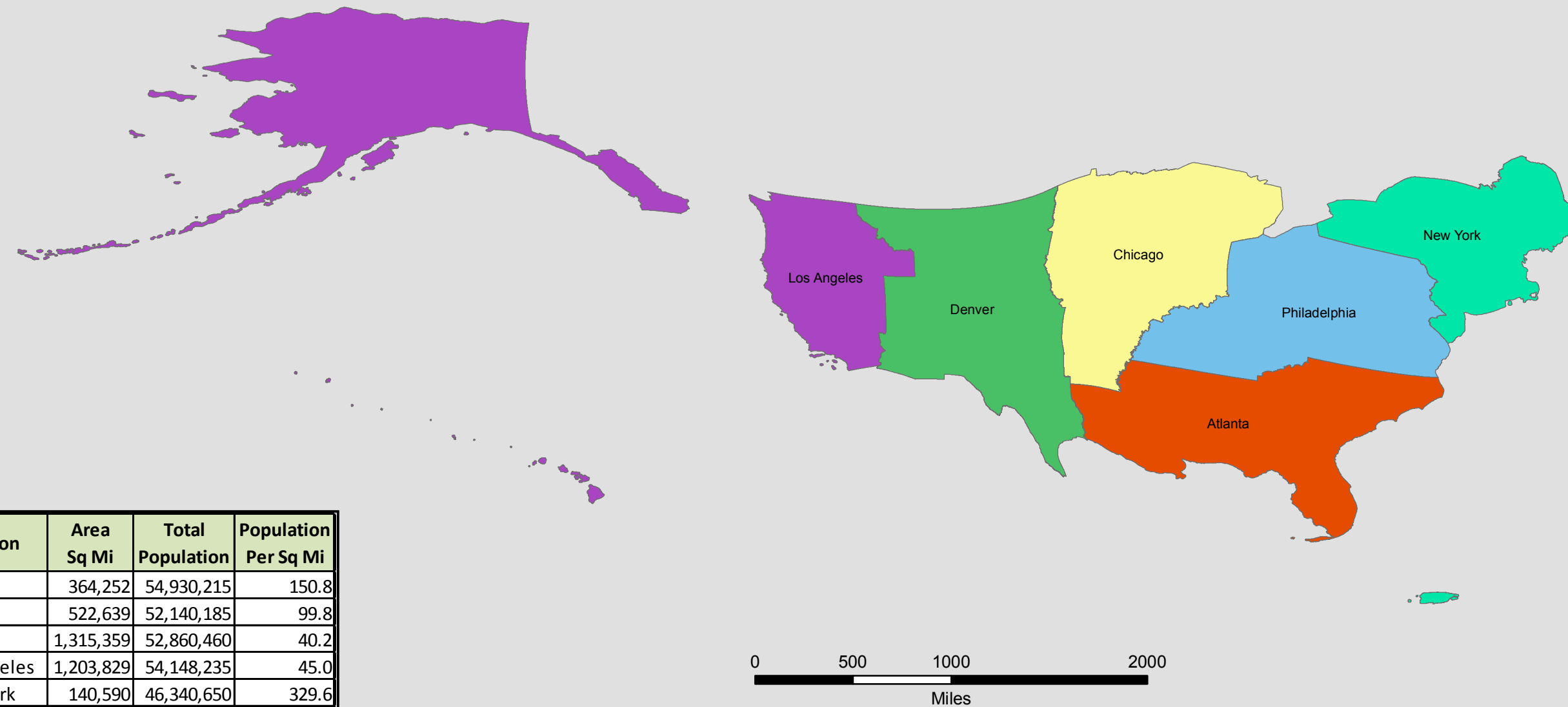


# Cartogram of the US Census Regions using Total Population from the 2010 Census



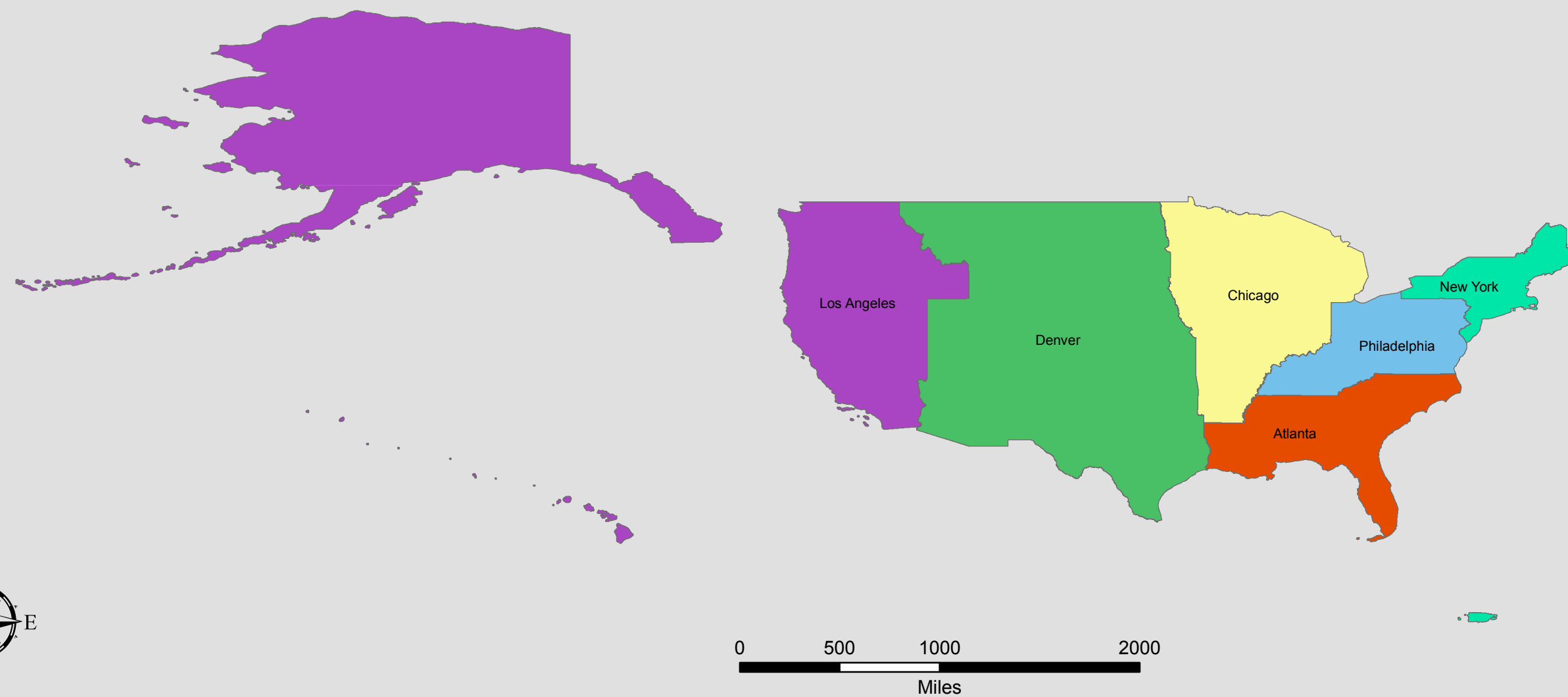

A cartogram is a map in which some thematic mapping variable such as Population is substituted for land area. The geometry or space of the map is distorted in order to convey the information of this alternate variable.

This Population cartogram is a value-by-area map, which illustrates the relative sizes of the populations scaling the area of each region in proportion to its population.

The shape and relative location of each region is retained as much of an extent as possible, but inevitably a large amount of distortion occurs.
